Our Reason to Exist

To collect a minimum set of data elements that will provide specific, useful, actionable information to facilitate the continued improvements in EMS service and patient care statewide.



OBJECTIVES & MEASURES

 - *% within specified timeframes,*
 - *Data quality metrics*

3. **Continue National Compliance**
 - *Submission to national data base &*
 - *Milestone progress on migration to NEMESIS 3.0*

4. **Improve Accessibility, Reporting & Decision Support**
 - *Milestone progress on data mart/linkages*

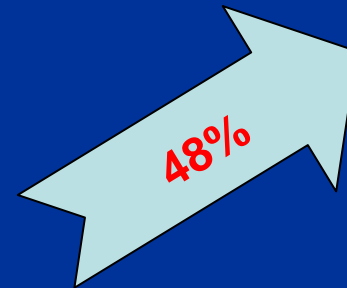

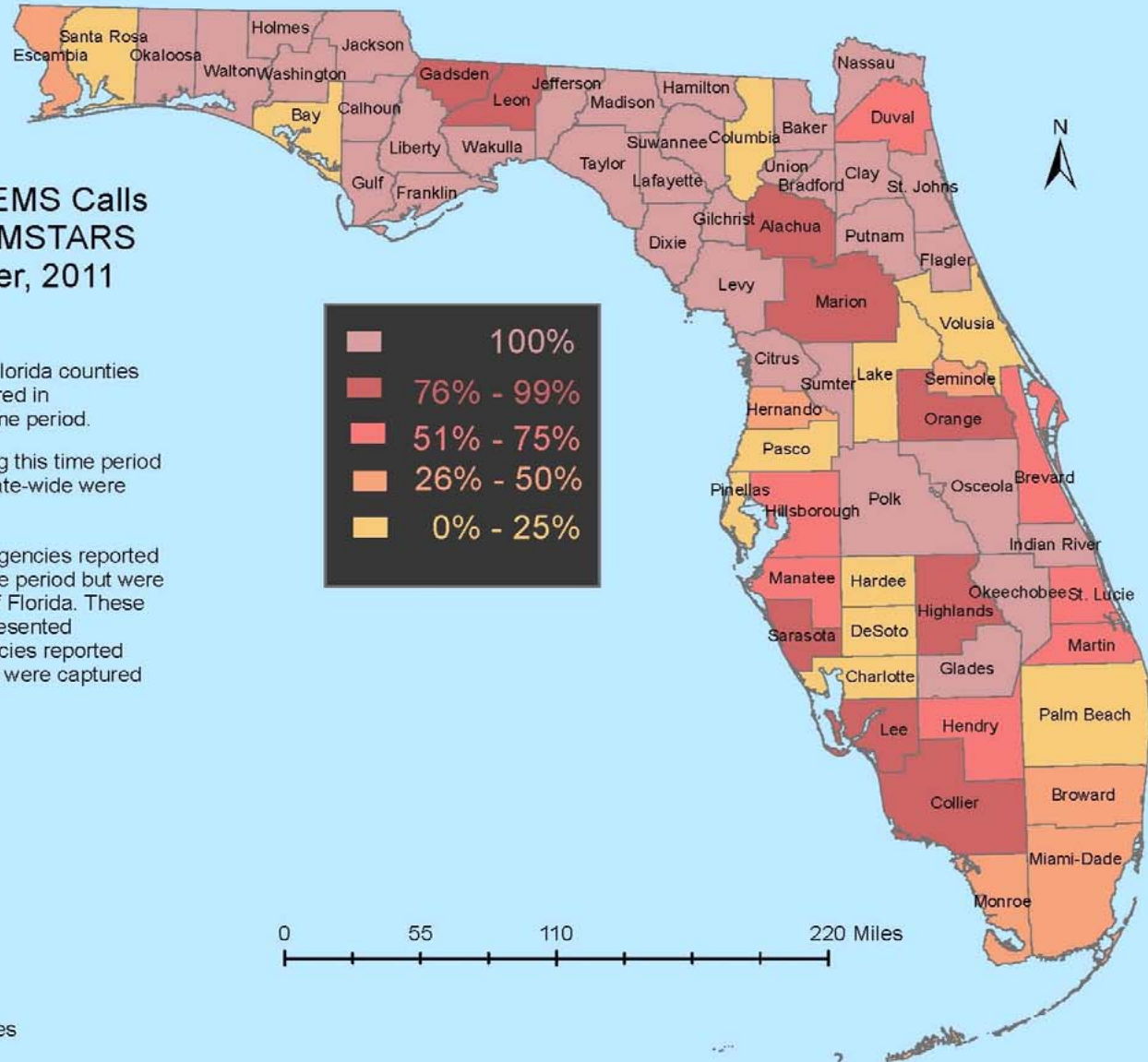


Percentage of EMS Calls Captured by EMSTARS in First Quarter, 2011

Thirty-four (50.75%) of Florida counties had all EMS calls captured in EMSTARS during this time period.

Total reported calls during this time period was 848,187; 50.46% state-wide were captured by EMSTARS.

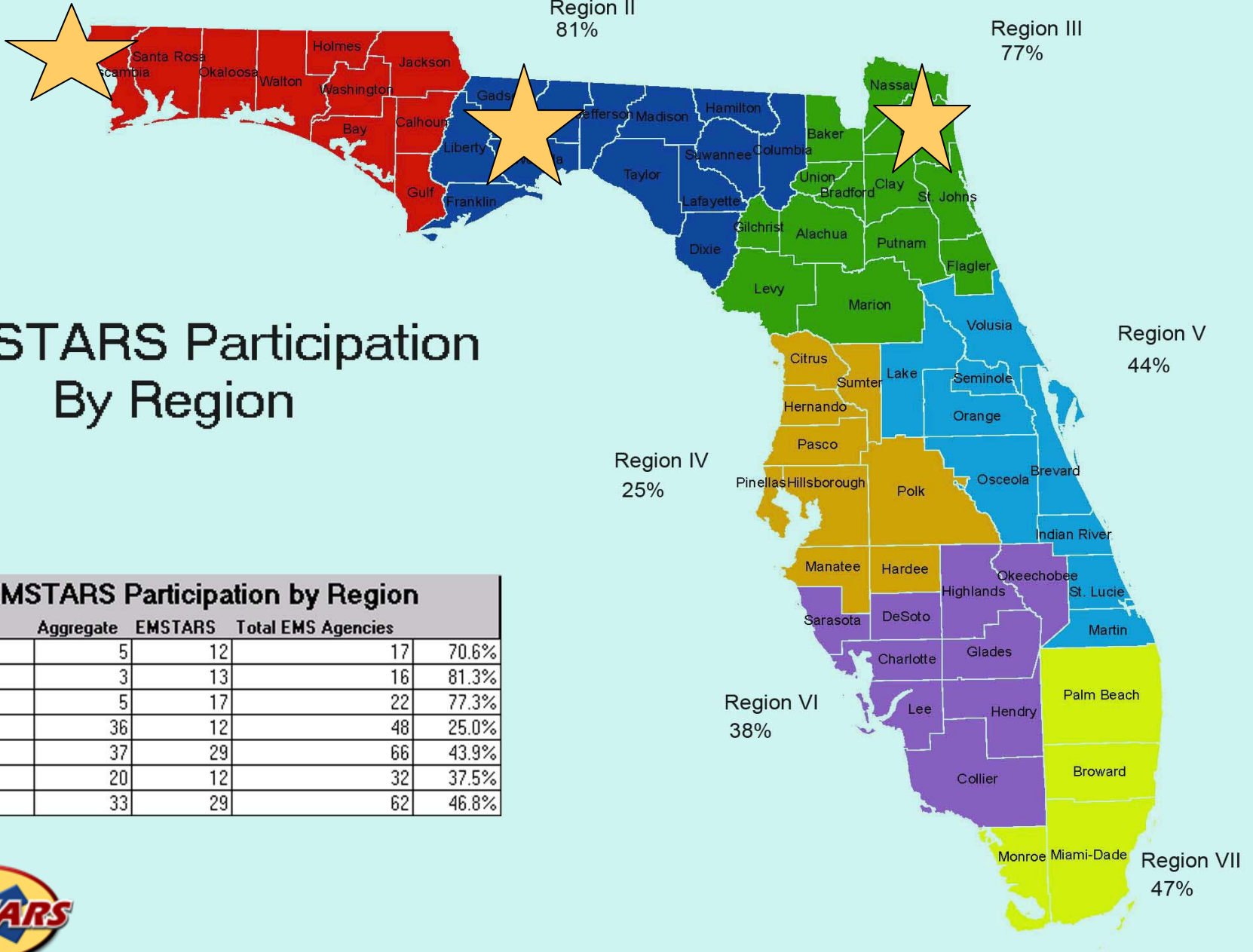
Nine EMS air transport agencies reported EMS calls during this time period but were headquartered outside of Florida. These air agencies are not represented on this map. These agencies reported 1558 calls, 89% of which were captured in EMSTARS.

- 45% EMS reports sent within 30 days of incident

■ Accuracy

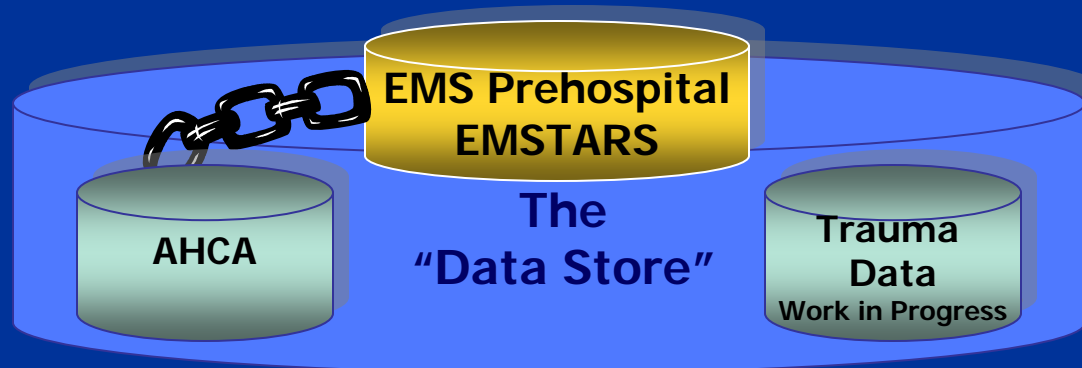
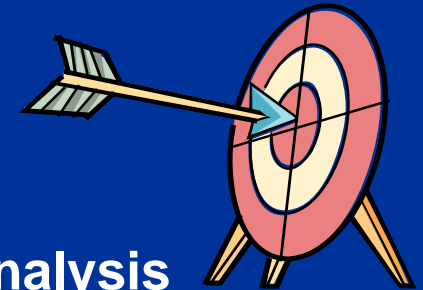
- 92% data validation score

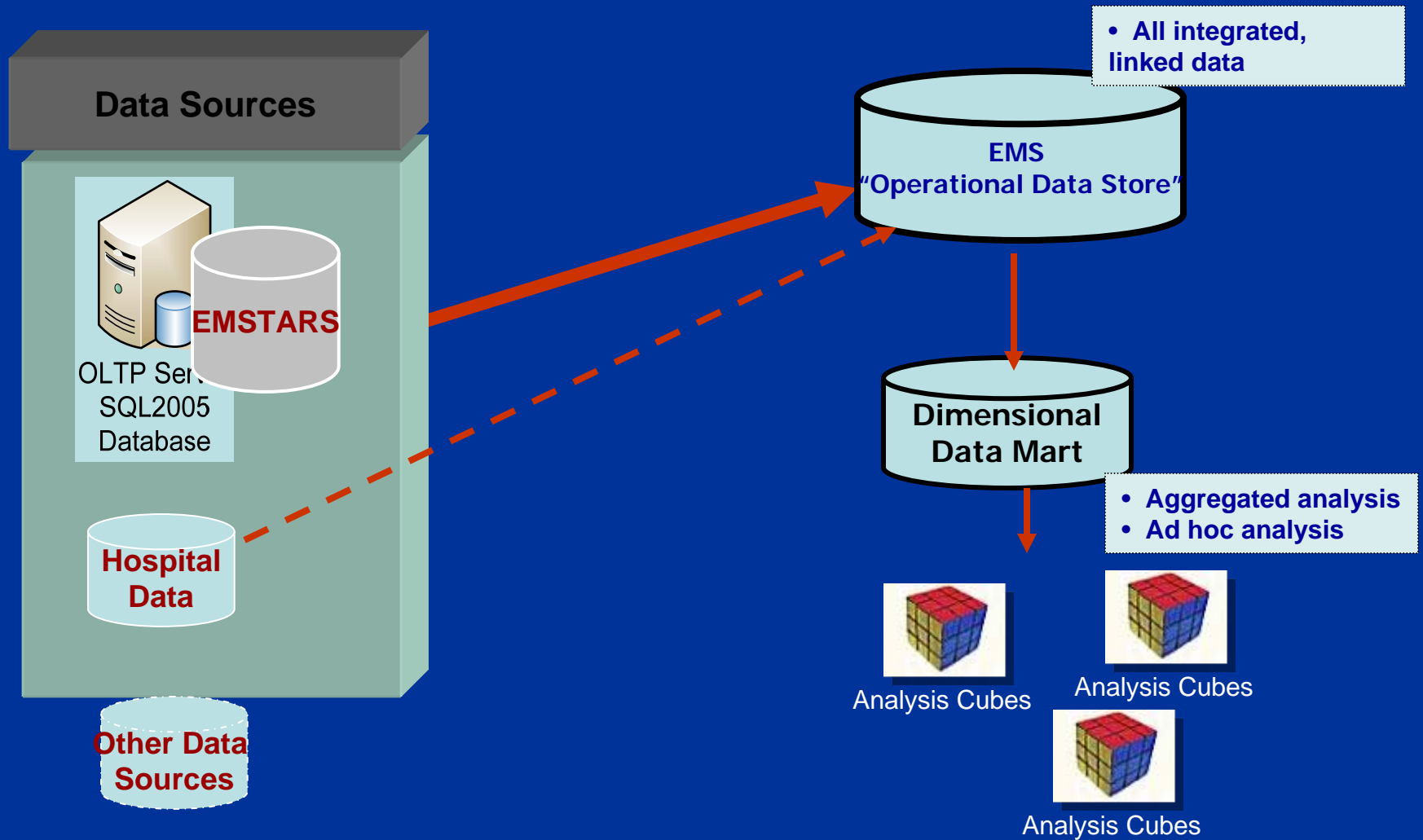

The Gap



EMSTARS 1.4
& NEMSIS 2.2.1

- A uniform dataset - Data Dictionary → • Missing elements that complete the picture and more completely describe the incident (STEMI, Cardiac Arrest, Airway)
- Uniform transmission method XML files via sFTP → • Inadequate integration potential – (Harmonization and Portability with other Systems and Equipment)
- State Business Rules for Quality Data Collection → • Code sets that are not standard across other patient/incident stakeholders (RxNorm, ICD-10, ANSI)
- No uniform business rule validation



DRAFT TIMELINE (“very” draft)

- **NEMESIS V3 Official Release** **10/31/11**
- **Develop Florida Transition Plan** **11/30/11**
- **Implementation Phase** **12/1/11 – 12/30/12**
- **NEMESIS Certification Phase** **1/01/13 - 5/30/13**
- **Begin Agency Transition Phase** **6/01/13 – TBD**

Agency Impact

If not done already

NOW is the time to start considering the impact of NEMSIS 3.0 on your agency's operations

V3 is very likely to take affect during the contract period you have with your vendor.

- Have you initiated discussions with your vendor regarding NEMESIS 3.0?
- Has your vendor committed to continue to provide EMS products in compliance with NEMESIS 3.0?
- Will their version 3 product include the ability to add state specific requirements in a timely and cost effective manner?
- Has your vendor already begun developing v3 Products?
- When does your vendor plan to test its v3 products? - *Get your vendor's implementation plan - Testing starts in October 2011.*

NEMESIS 3.0 Questions



- Will your product collect v2 and v3 simultaneously to allow for the transition of State data submission and billing services?
- Will your product include the ability to add state specific requirements in a timely and cost effective manner?
- Does your contract include a clause that our software will be capable of meeting State requirements without additional costs or at least at a set rate so you know what to expect?
- Is your billing services provider prepared or in progress to utilize ICD-10 codes by the compliance date of 10/13?
